

The 4th of July is just around the corner ... Please be a courteous neighbor and clean up after fireworks displays and any debris left behind! Firework usage per city code is July 2-3 10 a.m.-11 p.m. July 4th 10 a.m.- midnight. Remember to get your free permit from the city and be safe!

Reminder that QUITE HOURS ... FOR ALL CITY NEIGHBORHOODS ARE FROM 11 p.m. to 7 a.m. If you are having a party that goes into the night, please talk to your neighbors or go inside after 11 p.m. to be considerate of your neighbors. This also includes mowing your lawn at a reasonable hour not to disturb your neighbor. We can have a peaceful neighborhood if everyone abides by this.

Reminder ... Homes Association dues were due by June 1st. After June 1st late fees apply. If not paid by September 30th your trash collection will be stopped, penalties, interest and a lien will be filed on your home. If you need to make payment arrangements, please contact us.

Reminder ... Please keep our neighborhood safe for our children, pets and protect yourself. OBSERVE the 25-m.p.h. speed limit.



IMPORTANT REMINDERS ... Please maintain your property, this includes fences. Trim your bushes and trees so they are not obstructing sidewalks. In the spring many homeowners make changes to the outside of their homes (paint color, fences, out buildings, etc.) Avoid headaches and extra costs, have your plans reviewed by the board first. Make sure you do not need a permit with the city also.

Please respect your fellow neighbors' property and do not forget to pick up what your dog leaves behind when out walking your dog. It's the right thing to do!!! Obey the leash laws!!! This applies to cats

also!!!



Per the restrictions and city code, trash and recycle bins must not be visible from the street from either the front or sides of your house with, of course, the exception of trash day collection.

Please do your part to comply and avoid unnecessary conflicts and expenses from the HOA and the city by placing your trash and recycle bins out of sight.

If you place your trash bins on the side of your home please enclose it so the bins are not visible from the street. Here are some great examples from our neighborhood below. You can also get examples by google searching outside trash bins enclosures.
